Our next meeting will be held on March 13th, a notable day in history when in:

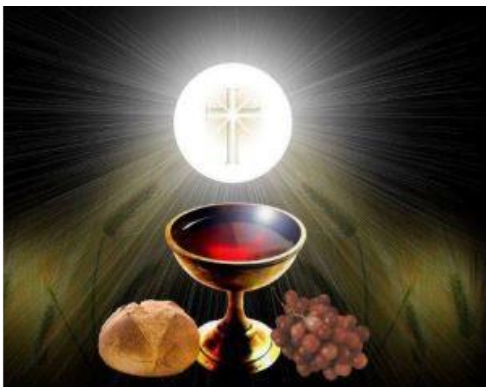
1877 Chester Greenwood patented the earmuff.
